IOI also ramped up Helmet Cover production for a December Deployment in record time.





Four Clay County students that were participating in the Pre-**Employment Transition Services** (PreETS), took part in an internship at IOI. This was the first internship that the PreETS program had ever done and the students had to complete at least sixty hours for the internship to be completed. It allowed the students to get real work experience but still have the support of a PreETS instructor should they need it.

2022 - IOI receives notice that our National CARF Accreditation response to the Ukraine War. had been issued based on the recent survey. This is the highest accreditation a Community Rehabilitation Program can attain. The survey results noted at IOI employs skilled, compassionate, and hardworking staff members that are responsive to the needs of the persons served. There is a noticeable commitment to improving the quality of life of the persons served and assisting them in employment and becoming active
